TO END ALL WARS
HISTORICAL SOCIETY TO OBSERVE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE
OUTBREAK OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR



Archduke Franz Ferdinand, heir to the Austrian throne, was assassinated in Serbia on June 28, 1914. Within a month bullets were flying in Europe. Four years later, with sixteen million dead, the conflict we now call the First World War was over. One hundred years later we look back at the problems put in motion by this event.

At the November meeting of the Foxborough Historical Society, **Dr. Gary Hylander** will observe the 100th anniversary of World War I or “The Great War,” as it was called at the time, with a lecture entitled “To end all wars.”

2014 marks the centennial of the outbreak of the Great War of 1914-1918. It began on the morning of June 28, 1914 in the distant Balkans with the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand.

Now modern tools of slaughter appeared on the battlefield: flamethrowers, machine-guns and poison gas to name a few. The carnage was appalling.

Four empires were destroyed; millions perished. Despite early neutrality even the United States was pulled into the conflict.

The Great War is where the 19th and 20th centuries parted ways forever.

The historical society will meet Tuesday evening, Nov. 25, at 7:30 pm, in the first-floor Community Meeting Room of the Boyden Library. The library is at the corner of Bird and Baker Streets in Foxboro center. Enter by the Baker Street entrance. Parking is available on nearby streets and around the Common. (Please do not park in the Aubuchon lot.) Admission is free and all are welcome.

If interested in joining the Foxborough Historical Society, ask for an application form at the check-in table the night of the meeting. Annual dues are \$8 for individuals and \$10 for an entire family.

50 YEARS AGO IN FOXBOROUGH
NOVEMBER 1964

- Use of Memorial Hall urged for Town Historical Society.
- New school passes Special Town Meeting unanimously.
- 12 miles of US Route 95 here to be opened for travel soon.
- Parking area behind stores started.
- Set of chains is the best bet for winter drivers.
- Foxboro's fifteen man police department.
- Jewish patients observe Hanukkah at Foxboro State Hospital.

DECEMBER 1964

- Foxboro fans whoop it up on Thanksgiving Day after 16-10 victory, a great win for Coach Tom Sullivan. This was the 4th consecutive win over Mansfield.
- School Committee denies request for teachers' 6% pay raise. This would have increased the minimum salary from \$5,000 to \$5,300.
- Crèche on Common admired by many. It has been a feature of the community Christmas observance for several years since it was created through funds raised by local women.
- Survey of sewer needs to be asked at 1965 Town Meeting.
- Start moving in new town hall in January.
- Selectmen conduct last meeting in old bank building quarters.
